Summary: To adopt a Revenue Purpose Statement specifying the use of revenues the Belmont- Klemme Community School District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund.

In the Belmont-Klemme Community School District, the following Revenue Purpose Statement which specifies the use of revenues the Belmont-Klemme Community School District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund shall be adopted.

To provide funds to acquire or install information technology infrastructure (including improving buildings or sites for the purpose of accessing broadband digital telecommunications) and school safety and security infrastructure.

To provide funds to build and furnish a new school building or buildings; to build and furnish addition(s) to school buildings in the District; to remodel, reconstruct, repair, expand, and improve the school buildings in the District; to purchase and improve grounds; for demolition work; to furnish and equip district facilities.

To provide funds for the purchase, lease or lease-purchase of buildings, equipment (including transportation and recreation equipment), or technology and to repair transportation equipment for transporting students as authorized by law, to implement energy conservation measures, sharing or rental of facilities including a joint infrastructure project for the purposes of offering classes under district-to-community college programs as authorized in Iowa Code Section 423F.3(3)(c), procuring or acquisition of libraries, or opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings.

To provide funds to purchase land as part of start-up costs for new student construction program or if the sale of the previous student construction was insufficient to purchase land, and to purchase construction materials and supplies for a student-constructed building or shed intended to be retained by and used by the District.

To provide funds to make payments to a municipality or other entity as required under Iowa Code Section 403.19(2).

To provide funds for demolition, cleanup, and other costs if such costs are necessitated by, and incurred within two years of, a disaster.

To provide funds to establish and maintain public recreation places and playgrounds; provide for supervision and instruction for recreational activities; or for community education purposes.

To provide funds for the payment of principal and interest or retirement of general obligation bonds issued for school infrastructure purposes, energy improvement loans, loan agreements authorized by Iowa Code Section 297.36, sales, service and use tax revenue bonds issued under Iowa Code Section 423E.5 or Iowa Code Section 423F.4.

To provide funds for property tax relief; and

To provide funds for other authorized expenditures and purposes as now or hereafter permitted by law and designated by the Belmont-Klemme Community School District.

It being understood that if this proposition should fail to be approved by the voters, such failure shall not be construed to terminate or restrict authority previously granted by the voters to expend receipts from the Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund.

If approved, this Revenue Purpose Statement shall remain in effect until replaced or amended by the Belmont-Klemme Community School District.

POLLING PLACES:

The precinct polling places and addresses for this election are as follows: These are the same as the Primary and General Election

Belmond Precinct: Belmond City Hall, 112 2nd Ave. NE, Belmond, IA (for voters in the City of Belmond, City of Rowan, and the Townships of Belmond, Pleasant and Iowa)

Clarion & Big 6 Precinct: Wright County Courthouse, 115 N. Main Street, Clarion, IA (for voters in the City of Clarion and the Townships of Norway, Dayton, Lake, Lincoln, Grant, and Wall Lake)

Dows Precinct: Dows Convention Center/City Hall, 119 E. Ellsworth, Dows, IA (for voters in the City of Dows, City of Galt and the Townships of Blaine and Vernon)

Eagle Grove Precinct: Eagle Grove Memorial Hall, 200 South Park Ave. Eagle Grove, IA (for voters in City of Eagle Grove Wards 1-4, the City of Woolstock and the Townships of Troy, Woolstock, and Eagle Grove)

Goldfield Precinct: Goldfield Legion Hall, 505 N. Main Street, Goldfield, IA (for voters in the City of Goldfield and the Townships of Boone and Liberty)

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered in their current residential precinct, i.e., voters registering to vote on Election Day and voters changing precincts, must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence, if required) has the following options:

1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct; 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents; or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of

identity/residence at the county auditor's office by 12 noon on Tuesday, November 9, 2021. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. For additional information about providing proof of identity and/or residence visit: <https://sos.iowa.gov/voterid>.
